GUIDE TO MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS 2022

GENERAL INFORMATION

Middle School Summer School classes will be offered at Grassfield High School and Western Branch High School.

- GFHS: Students from CWM, GBM, GRM, HMS, HOM, IRM
- WBHS: Students from DCM, JMS, OSM, and WBM

Classes will be held 8:00 a.m. – 12:45 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Schools will be closed on Fridays, and on Monday, July 4, 2022. Core academic classes are offered during the ten-day sessions. Enrichment classes are offered during an eight-day session. **All classes are dependent on sufficient enrollment, and the availability of qualified and appropriately endorsed instructional staff.**

REGISTRATION

Registration forms will be available at the school counseling office of each middle school beginning in April. **Chesapeake Public Schools students may register for summer school courses beginning May 13, 2022.** Registration for **enrichment** classes should be completed **by May 20, 2022.** Registration for all other middle school classes should be completed by **Friday, June 10, 2022,** at the student’s home school. Students that need to repeat a class (**that have not already been registered**) can do so at their home school on the dates and times below:

ATTENDANCE

Student attendance is expected. Attendance regulations will apply to summer school students. During the regular school year, schools are governed by school board policy that requires the student to attend the current session for a minimum number of days. If the student fails to meet these requirements, he or she may not receive a passing grade for that session. This requirement for middle school ten-day class sessions means that **students cannot miss more than two days.**

STUDENT CONDUCT

Appropriate student conduct is vital to ensuring a safe, orderly learning environment. Student conduct and policy guidelines for the 2021-2022 school year will remain in effect during all Summer School sessions. Since participation in Summer School is not mandatory, students who present discipline problems while in transit to or from school, at bus stops, or while on school grounds are subject to disciplinary action. Students who present discipline problems will not be allowed to continue attending, including being dismissed from the program.

TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation will be provided for Summer School students. Transportation will be limited and will likely be a designated neighborhood pick-up point. Specific bus schedules for all schools can be viewed on the Summer School section of the Chesapeake Public Schools website beginning one week before Summer School. Bus routes will be updated one week before the second session begins.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Classes will be held from 8:00 a.m. – 12:45 p.m.
Schools will be closed on Fridays, and on Monday, July 4, 2022.

Repeat Classes (Ten-Day Class)

Middle School repeat classes are offered to students in grades 6-8 who need to repeat academic classes necessary for promotion to the next grade level. Each class will meet for ten days. A student may take a maximum of two repeat classes during the summer; however, only one class per session may be taken. To be eligible to repeat a class, a student must have made an “E” in the course during the 2021-2022 school year. To be eligible to repeat a class a student who made a “D” in the course must have permission from his or her school principal. The home school principal makes the final decision for a student to repeat a course.

Special Education

English Learners (EL)

The EL program is designed for students who are in grades six through eight who are in the process of learning English as a second language and whose proficiency levels are 1, 2, and 3. Teachers will focus on instructing to enhance their vocabulary and improve their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment (WIDA) standards will be used to integrate language development and content learning appropriate to the grade level and proficiencies of the students.
