1. The Chesapeake Preschool Initiative (CPI) serves at risk 4-year-old children and is located at seven elementary schools. The enrollment figure is for informational purposes.
2. The Pre-K program serves children, ages 2-4, with a significant developmental delay in one or more of the following areas: cognitive ability, motor skills, social/adaptive behavior, perceptual skills, and communication skills.
3. Students attending one of the two centers are included in the totals for their home rooms. The enrollment figures for these centers are provided for informational purposes.
4. The first figure shows the number of 12th graders; the second figure shows the number of post-high school students.
5. Capacities are reviewed annually and may change based on building modifications, program changes, and/or special education needs. Reductions for social distancing due to COVID-19 are not included.
6. Last year's 2020-21 enrollment was lower than expected due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2021-22 enrollment increase represents the partial recovery of the previous year's enrollment loss.
